American Red Cross – Logan County Chapter 7308

2011 Allocation: \$53,644

Actively serves the needs of Logan County disaster victims, as well as provides health and safety education to Logan County citizens. United Way dollars fund the Disaster Services and Health and Safety programs of the American Red Cross.

Boy Scouts of America, Last Frontier Council – Logan County 7301

2011 Allocation: \$6,910

Mobilizes individuals and organizations to instill within youth the qualities of duty to God and country, service to others and obligations to one's self. United Way funding enables the Boy Scouts to provide scholarships to individuals who are unable to pay to participate in the camping program.

Supports Logan County Aging Services. United Way funding provides home bound seniors with meals.

Provides emergency shelter care and outpatient counseling for schools and drug and alcohol counseling services. United Way funding benefits the Maudie Hirschi Children's Shelter.

Trains developmentally disabled adults in work and life skills, which enables them to eventually take partial or total control of their lives. United Way funding supports the Sheltered Workshop program.
